12. Key qualifications:

- René is a highly *flexible* person who is used to work under very difficult circumstances (Iraq, Afghanistan, Turkish/Syrian border) and who knows to get the job done using very creative and practical solutions;
- He is a person with strong *analytical skills* that enables him to get a relevant overview in a very short time and make quick decisions in times of emergency;
- Important for his work is a *contextual approach*. Within UNESCO (ICC committees, meetings and conferences) he was successful to stress the relation between Cultural Heritage and Development

(Cultural Policies as part of the National Development Plans: Haiti and Afghanistan) and Cultural Heritage and Peace (Syria)

- Especially working in developing or unstable countries René finds it very important to communicate his *commitment* and *perseverance*. The stakeholders have to know that he is a reliable partner. It took him two weeks to convince the Iraq Minister of Culture that he was there to assist him and nothing else. To build sustainable relations he prefers to go out 'in the field' and get the people involved as much as possible in the decision making process (*participatory approach*);
- His *broad training* in the social sciences (anthropology, sociology, social psychology) enables him to easily propose 'out-of-the-box' solutions. As a certified conservator his knowledge of the natural sciences certainly helps to understand technical problems better. In Bangladesh he developed handmade paper from water hyacinth and put that in a wider ecological perspective;
- René considers *sharing* experiences and knowledge as an essential part of his work. Over the years this resulted in excellent writing skills (> 40 publications) and strong presentational skills (> 90 lectures, master classes, courses, trainings)
